### **Homework Consultation**

Our thanks to the group of parents who came into school to help us review our homework policy. After further consultation with all parents the feedback was that:

The majority of parents/carers thought Homework Challenges should discontinue.

The majority of parents/carers would like homework to reinforce literacy and numeracy.

Reading homework should continue.

The majority of parents/carers would like to get all the homework on a Monday - especially in the upper school where pupils often have to balance homework with clubs.

A web page with links to support learning would be useful.

Above all, homework should be manageable and stress free!
